Natalie Marie Daniel was born September 12, 1985 in Muskogee, OK to Ron and Rhonda (Watson) Daniel; where she lived until 1996. She attended public schools and lived in Bartlesville until 2006. She moved to the Nowata area where she studied and achieved an Associate's Degree in Business with a focus on Accounting, from Rogers State University.
