Cassandra Layne Wilfong, 63, of Bartlesville, Oklahoma, died on January 10, 2025 at Ascension St. John Jane Phillips Hospital.

Cassandra was born Bonnie Wolfgang on January 31, 1961 in Cambridge, Ohio to Harold Wolfgang and Mary Hern. She was adopted early in life by Thomas Lane Thorne and Edna Dell Thorne of Fairmont, West Virginia. 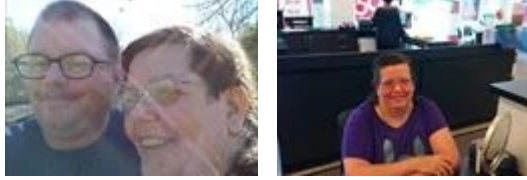
