Deloris June Smith, 89, of Dewey, died Monday, November 5, 2018, in Bartlesville.

She grew up working in her grandmother's restaurant and played basketball in school. She married Jay E. Smith and the couple made their home in Nowata. One son Steven Wayne Smith was born to this union, Steven preceded his parents in death due to complications from a motorcycle accident. Jay worked for Phillips Petroleum Company and was assigned to work in Alaska, California and Stavanger, Norway. Once retired, the couple moved back to their home in Dewey to care for their son.

Deloris loved to cook and eat, and she took pride in her home. In addition to being a homemaker, she was also an Amway distributor. The couple loved to travel and she loved spotting live red cardinals and collecting the manmade versions. She enjoyed going to the state fairs and playing the guessing games with carnival workers. Deloris was a member of the Dewey First Church of God. She served as a youth leader and Sunday School teacher in the Nowata Church.
