“Devin was my best friend. He kept me company in some of the loneliest moments of my life and somehow always knew how to make me smile on the hardest days. The first time I met him was on the bus early in the morning, the sun just starting to come up. I always sat alone, and he was the only one who noticed. Every day he'd sit a little closer until one day he sat right next to me, and once I finally took my headphones out, we were never separated after that.

We sat together every day, joking, laughing, talking about things I don't think anyone else ever heard from him, and things I'll never repeat. He had the kindest heart. One time he accidentally smacked my face while playing around, and even though it didn't hurt, he felt so bad he begged me to hit him back. That was just who he was - he couldn't stand the thought of hurting anyone.

He always stood up for me when I was getting bullied. He'd scare off anyone who tried to mess with me, wipe my face when I cried, pick me up when I felt like I couldn't stand on my own. A true big brother.

The last time I saw him was years later while I was working at the gas station. We hadn't talked in a long time, just life going different directions like it does. He asked me to hang out that weekend, and I told him I couldn't because I had to work. I never thought that would be the last time I'd see him, and I'll always wish I had said yes.

Devin had one of the sweetest souls I've ever known, and I will always be grateful that he chose to sit next to the quiet kid on the bus that morning.
