Erma Jewel Juliano, 93, of Bartlesville, went home to be with her Lord on August 5, 2020.

Erma, who was affectionately known as Jewel, was born March 26, 1927, to Lee and Rena Henry. Jewel had four siblings and they were raised in Zie in Southeast Oklahoma by their father, after their mother, Rena, had passed when Jewel was only 6 years old.
