George Alvin Ramsey, 77, a lifelong resident of Dewey, passed away on Friday, August 11, 2023.

George was born January 26, 1946, in Bartlesville, OK, to Fred Ramsey and Margaret (Welch) Campbell. He grew up and continued to live in Dewey. He loved playing football during his years at Dewey High School and graduated in 1965. George attended Okmulgee Tech for two years before he was drafted in 1967 into the United States Army and served in the Vietnam War.

George married the love of his life Kenna Lowry on December 21, 1968, at the Dewey First Christian Church, shortly after returning from Vietnam.

George enjoyed farming and ranching until he was no longer physically able. Wyoming had a special place in his heart, and he made many trips there to visit family.

George is survived by his wife of 54 years, Kenna; a son, Chad Ramsey and wife Alecia; a brother, Kenneth Freeman and wife Wanda; three sisters, Elizabeth Ramsey, Ragenna Tudor, and Anna Emamghoraishi and husband Tony; and a granddaughter, Sophia Ramsey. He was preceded in death by his parents and a brother, Tony Ramsey.
