



James "Jim" William Miller

January 9, 1931 - March 24, 2025

On March 24, 2025, at the age of 94, James William Miller made his final approach into eternity, leaving behind a lifetime of love, laughter and cherished memories. He passed peacefully after a week surrounded by family and friends.

Jim was born on January 9, 1931, in Oklahoma City and grew up on a farm north of Dewey, Oklahoma. He graduated high school in 1949 before enlisting in the U.S. Army, where he served with honor from 1951-1953.

On January 11, 1951, Jim married the love of his life, Louise Ella Jordan, beginning a beautiful journey of family, faith and legacy. Together they built a life filled with love, hard work and unforgettable memories.

While stationed at Fort Sill in Lawton, Jim and Louise welcomed their daughter, Constance Susan Miller, on September 7, 1953. Their son, Stanley James Miller, was born on October 3, 1955, in Tulsa, Oklahoma. As an oilman, Jim's career led the family to follow oil booms across Oklahoma and Kansas, where he held positions with various oil companies.

In 1974, Jim, Louise, and their children turned an idea into reality by founding Lamamco Drilling Company. What began as a single oil lease grew into one of the largest independent oil companies in Oklahoma, becoming a defining

chapter of their lives for decades. Jim found great joy in working alongside his children and their partners, fostering a legacy that has now become a multigenerational endeavor.

Jim and his family shared a deep love for traveling and exploring. His grandchildren fondly recall treasured times at "the farm," where Grandma and Grandpa created a home filled with warmth, go-kart and golf-kart rides; and endless games—memories that will be cherished for generations.

He enjoyed tinkering, especially with his beloved Model T. Each year, he lovingly decorated it for Christmas, bringing smiles to family, friends and the neighborhood. Jim was a faithful member of First Baptist Church of Dewey and was a kind, generous and humble man whose sense of humor will be deeply missed by all who knew him.
