My mom worked for Joe Frank of Houston, a very high end women's clothing manufacturing company, where she won many awards for her talent, and was one of the chosen for a >HOT order< out of hundreds of seamstresses. project and it would be made for her on the spot!!!! To do that you would have to be the best.

My mom started her seamstress career at 14 making men's dress shirts, at the same time her older sister Alejandra started a teaching job. Together they became providers of the family. Their dad, my grandfather, took ill and there were lots of mouths to feed. This kept my Mom away from her true passion: learning and studying. This would drive her life to instill her children to get a career. She taught us that with God all things are possible.

She had a magical way of bringing joy every time she walked into the room. No one who met her could forget her smile. Her motherly advice was sought by many; she taught both adults and children. Her wisdom will forever guide the decisions we make through the rest of our lives.

Maria is survived by her children, Rosa Flores, Elisa Salas and husband Joan Alberto, and Martha S. Lemay and husband Dr. William Lemay.
