February 2, 1944 - January 12, 2024

Pearlie "Jayne" George, 79, of Ramona, joined her beloved husband, Donald, in Heaven on Friday, January 12, 2024.

Jayne was born February 2, 1944, in Hooker, Oklahoma, to Aaron C. and Ethyl L. (Atterberry) Barnes. In addition to Hooker, she spent her childhood in Liberal, Kansas, and eventually in Ramona, Oklahoma, where she attended high school through the 11th grade.

She married Donald Arthur George Sr., on November 15, 1962, and they soon started their family. She was a wonderful mother and MeMe, giving her family lots of love and attention. She taught her family the love of God and not to say bad words. Schazbott was a common phrase in her vocabulary.

Jayne was very involved in the First Baptist Church of Ramona for many years, serving in the nursery, helping with Vacation Bible School, singing in the choir, volunteering with Girls in Action and even painting the ceiling when everyone else thought it was too high to reach. She took her family to church every Sunday and Wednesday for their whole early years.

While Jayne was ready to go Home and see her Poppy again, her loved ones will miss the self-professed "27-year-old," who claimed never to get older after the age of 27.

Jayne is survived by her children, Donald Arthur George Jr., Stephanie DeeAnn Smith, Tracy Lynn George, Shannon Schultz and husband Curt, and Darlene Barbour; a brother, Jimmy Beard; six grandchildren, Michelle Davis and husband Michael, James Kahler and wife Rachel, Evan Smith and wife Summer, Kevin George, Whitney George, and Rebecca McDonald; and 13 great-grandchildren, Owen, Eli, Raelyn, Maci, Kaleb, Kensley, Jaxen, Blake, Layne, Brody, Dash, Briar, and Kaysin. “ My chest feels heavy, my brain is all over the place and my heart?.....I’m almost 60 years old and I now know what a shattered heart feels like. 💔

There is absolutely no way I can put into words what Jayne George meant to me and my sister, Darlene L. Barbour. No words great enough. No words perfect enough. No words in any book that are enough.

But I’m going to try to put my feelings into words that honor the most incredible, amazingly wonderful, loving human being I have ever known.

“Angel”. That’s what Darlene and I have always referred to her as.....I looked up the definition of an angel.

The word suggests goodness, and is often used to refer to someone who offers comfort and aid to others in times of trouble.

No truer words could there be because she was definitely that to us.

Jayne came into my life at 18 years old. I didn’t know her. My sister did and very well.

For those who don’t know our story....its a long one so I’m giving an abbreviated version picking up at the point I met my angel.

My sister and I were raised by an abusive father that literally started at birth. There is no sugar coating the situation. It is what it is.

The last time we ran away ...Darlene knew exactly where we needed to go. “Momma George’s house”. She (and Don) provided us a safe place to stay. And even though we were not “family” she never treated us any less than FAMILY💔

We were only two of the “pound puppies” (my words haha) she

rescued. There were a LOT of kids that walked through her door. The same house that took her life.

She helped us not only physically get away from him but helped us navigate the legal system to keep him away from us.

As time went on she, and against her better judgment 😊, helped me plan a simple wedding so I could get married. I was only 18 and just out of a horrible home life and she really didn't want me to get married that young. But we all know how we are at 18...we know everything haha. The marriage gave me two wonderful sons so zero regrets!

Darlene and I had been separated from our Mother for over 14 years (that's a whole other story). Following the aftermath of getting us away from our bad situation and me getting married, we were able locate our Mother in Canada. I was married and didn't plan to move but Darlene was still a minor. Jayne helped Darlene through the process and sent her off on the airplane that took her to our Mother ☐

When my sister got married....Jayne flew to Canada to be there. When I remarried 14 years ago....she and Steph came to our wedding.

So not only was she there to love and save us as kids....she never stopped!!!! She has always been in our lives. Everytime I go home for a visit I tried to stop by and visit her. My regret is that I didn't go more often.

The last time I talked to her was Friday, January 5th. It had been a few months since I had last called her and knew it was time to be better about calling. We talked for over an hour. She was so happy that I am so happy and that all my kids are doing well. We talked about Darlene and she was overjoyed that my sister has found love and happiness and doing so well.

I told her I was taking some days off from work and plan to come up for a visit around her birthday and she was so excited.....and so was I.

We talked about her life, as we always did. Jayne has always had a rough go of it. Personal things, family things and for damn sure her health situation. Most people would just give up. But not this angel.

Her words to me a little over a week ago....."as long as I can get to church every week and praise my God, I'm happy"

Neither of us could have imagined she would be holding Jesus' hand just a week later.

I'd be lying if I said I understand. I'm a Christian and I do NOT understand. How could such a woman so full of faith lose her life in a tragic house fire ? And a granddaughter and a great grandson as well?

I cannot dwell on it. It's not my nature and it does nothing positive. What I choose to do is remember the angel that God put in my life long before I knew who God was. I know she no longer suffers. Her vision is restored and her body is healthy and she is dancing in Heaven. THAT I have no doubt about.

So. While my heart is in a million pieces and tears creep in frequently....and will for awhile...my memories with her put a big ole smile on my face.

For I have truly known an angel right here on earth.

Please keep her entire family in your thoughts and prayers. Prayers for those who survived the fire and their recovery as well and all their family members that are hurting tonight.

Ramona, Oklahoma is a small town (I graduated from high school there) and small towns show up in droves for their own and we are

already seeing that happen.
