Virginia Faye Sartor, 94, of Bartlesville, died Tuesday, June 11, 2024, in Bartlesville, OK.

Virginia was born the daughter of Virgil Cecil and Sarah Louise (Tucker) Buchanan on January 12, 1930, in Holdenville, OK. She was raised and educated in Holdenville. From a young age she pursued her passion for music, singing in the school choir.

One day she took notice of Larry Sartor, a young Soda Jerk at the local pharmacy. They were in the same grade at school. They quickly fell in love and were high school sweethearts, graduating with the class of 1948. Virginia fondly remembered his younger siblings accompanied them on their dates to the drive-in movies.

Larry preceded her in death after 63 years of loving marriage on April 16, 2014.
